Subject: RE Year 3

## Links to prior learning.

What can we learn about Christian worship and beliefs by visiting churches? This unit builds on the Year 1 unit "What can we learn about Christianity from visiting a church?" In this unit pupils should have the opportunity to encounter several churches/ denominations (eg visits to differing local churches, virtual visits) and be introduced to diversity of worship and church buildings.

What do Hindus believe? This unit builds on the Key Stage 2 Unit 'How do Hindus worship?' as it explores the general beliefs behind the rituals and ceremonies which take place at home and in the mandir.
